#### From the February Committee Meeting:

MEANZ: MEANZ leadership awaiting responses to MAPs and shortly to Standard Operating Procedures. 16 clubs are overdue for Audit.

Halswell GLT: The green chairs are to be replaced by stronger chairs. There is a length of temporary track in the train shed. The cleaner contract is working well. Two seats installed by the pond.

Membership: Welcome to John Phillipson.

Website: Changes to the site include the listed indexes of some magazines.

Librarian: Ships and Scales DVD's (2) are on hand. 3 DVD's of the Flying Scotsman have been donated by Rob.

Boiler: Meeting before the AGM.

Safety: Suggested that a lockable gate be installed at northern end of the over bridge.

General Business: There will be no steam running until the Fire ban is lifted. A detailed Future Plan proposal must be put to membership to assure expenditure. A Saturday work team would be necessary for any construction projects. A sketch of changes to turntable area enabling easier 'park up' of trains displayed. 70 new carparks being built behind clubroom. Double stacking of trolleys and locos was discussed. Several technical solutions offered to enable a guard riding on trolley to stop train, to be trialled on one train. Night Run: Provisionally set for April 5th combined with club Barbecue. Capacity of the Ice Train Batteries declining. Tauranga Modellers use vacuum operated brake system in contrast to most clubs in NZ. This presents difficulties for clubs visiting Tauranga in January. Library shelving to be increased.

A sign warning of the toxic condition of the water has been set up. The pond level is now below the weir. It has been suggested that pond spraying is the cause of toxicity. Introduction of grass carp would resolve the issue. More fertiliser has been applied to the peninsular. Ducks appear to find the new grass acceptable. There has been an encouraging renewed interest in sailing vessels. There are doubts over the effectiveness of the Avanex grass. We will contact PGGW with a view to testing the levels of alkaloid present in the grass.



#### <u>FOR SALE:</u> 7 1/4 INCH DIESEL LOCOMOTIVE

Built by Jim Rooney of Timaru. Completed late 2012 and has only three outings, all at CSMEE. Estimated travelled distance only 90k, with no problems. Powered by a 20HP 3cyl industrial diesel engine direct coupled to industrial hydraulic pump feeding though industrial FWD/REV control valve to two low speed "gear/rotor" motors. The motor chain drives to all axles of the 3 axle bogies. The power bogies are steel fabrications with individual axle springing and ball race bearings and brakes. An air compressor provides air for braking.

Built to North American loading gauge but slightly shorter than scale length, paintwork and external detail to the Sante Fe outline. Full low voltage electrics fitted for starting, brake compressor and lighting.

Additional to the loco are a short driving trolley and three heavy duty all steel passenger trolleys. Currently stored at CSMEE where they can be demonstrated. Equipment has been well engineered with almost all new components.
