From the April Committee Meeting:

MEANZ: Rob outlined an IPENZ initiative that seeks to have IPENZ approve the appointment of Auditors and Competent Persons. The DOL have detailed the requirements for Club operation. Drivers Licences are to show locomotive approval type and expiry date. Licences are to be sighted on given running day. Up to date register of locomotives. A 'significant' keynote speaker is desired. Model aircraft and helicopter enthusiasts are to be invited. A "Challenge Idea" needed. The next meeting to continue with Canmod preparation is Tuesday 15th May. The Wednesday team is continuing with general maintenance tasks. Kitchen has been ordered.
